An exercise in pleasure and pain

David Sygall sets his sights high on the South Coast and comes away feeling most satisfied.

n Pigeon House Mountain no one can hear you scream. Or moan as your calf muscles seize up from the two-hour slog to the top. No, there's no one around to share your pain. The only sounds you hear at the summit of Pigeon House Mountain - so named by Captain Cook because of its resemblance to "a square dovehouse with a dome on top" - are fresh highaltitude winds and the flutter of squillions of birds filtering up from the forest below.

Not that this eerie picture should discourage either the avid climber or weekend walker. The 20-minute drive from our digs at Bushview Cottage, near Milton on the South Coast, is itself a treat – winding through dairy country before hitting a dirt track that takes you to the start of the climb.

The trek is challenging. But after negotiating a series of steel ladders and stairways that comprise the final stage, there's a genuine sense of achievement when you look from the mountains to the west across to Nowra, Jervis Bay and the beautiful coastline in the distance.

We couldn't have done the Pigeon House walk if our Bushview Cottage hosts, Roy and Judy, hadn't lent us their four-wheel-drive. Beyond the call of good bed and breakfast hosts, they were happy to lend us their spare wheels.

Roy and Judy opened Bushview Cottage just four months ago after moving from Victoria's Mornington Peninsula, where they had owned another B&B.

Bushview is renovated tastefully, with understated style that blends with the surrounding land. From the outside, the cottage looks ordinary. Inside, it's a big, warm space, with adjustable halogen lighting, local wattle and banksia flowers commanding a vase and historic photographs of nearby Milton hanging from the walls.

There's air-conditioning and heating, a lovely outdoor undercover setting surrounded by a sweetly landscaped garden and a mesmerising outdoor fireplace. It was a pleasure to cook the provided breakfast in the fully equipped kitchen one morning and on the barbecue the next, while birds enjoyed their own morning meals in

the gardens around us. Each afternoon, after a glass of wine and relaxing outdoor spa (particularly handy after our Pigeon House effort), we watched the supplied DVDs and played board games before falling asleep in the cushiest of beds.

The cottage is spotlessly clean and you feel as though you're the first person to stay there. Bushview

Cottage is said to be rated at four stars but Roy wants to make up the few points to reach 41/2. You sense he'll get his way.

He's a host with a wicked sense of humour and told us the cottage is the perfect place to come when one feels the onset of a nervous breakdown. Certainly, hiding away here for a night or five can be restorative.

But it's worth getting out because the area is vibrant. Milton township, established in 1860, is now listed with the National Trust and features quaint old buildings restored to century-old glory. We stopped in at the celebrated Rainbow Pie Shop and the lolly shop next door, of which Willy Wonka would be proud.

The previous night we'd gone to

nearby Ulladulla and enjoyed a topclass meal at the oldest building in town, Millard's Cottage, built in 1868.

Milton is tiny but the shops are magical, with an array of locally made handicrafts, oils, ointments, candles, jewellery, clothes, antiques and artwork. For the golf tragics, I'm told nearby Mollymook has one of the best courses in Australia.

There's no doubt Mollymook beach is also right up there, though I opted to enjoy the waves from a window seat at the Mollymook Golf Club, beer in hand. After conquering Pigeon House Mountain earlier that day, there wasn't much else I was up for.
